## The Angel of the Holocaust: Irena Sendler's Story

During the Nazi regime, the world witnessed unimaginable horrors. Hitler's concentration camps were designed to annihilate millions, including Jews, in gas chambers. Amidst this darkness, a beacon of hope emerged. Irena Sendler, a Polish nurse, risked her life to rescue 2,800 children from the Warsaw Ghetto. Irena would sneak into the ghetto, smuggle out children, and place them in safe homes. To prevent the children from crying and alerting the guards, she would sometimes administer a mild sedative or bring a barking dog to mask their sounds. Her bravery was extraordinary, given the Nazis' ruthlessness. Years later, when interviewed by a reporter, Irena shared the source of her strength. Her father, a doctor, had risked his life to treat patients during a deadly epidemic. Before passing away, he told Irena, "If you see someone drowning, even if you don't know how to swim, you have to jump in to save them... Showing an act of kindness never be afraid for your own life."



**Moral:** Irena's story teaches us that kindness, courage, and selflessness can conquer even the darkest of times. Her father's words inspired her to risk everything to save innocent lives, demonstrating that individual actions can make a significant difference.
